Available Scholarships:

James A. Mansfield Award:

The James A. Mansfield Award is funded by the Detroit Chapter and is administered by the chapter's Student Affairs Committee. This award, established in 1976, is presented to a Detroit metropolitan area ASM student chapter member or a Detroit chapter student member in recognition of high scholastic achievement.

The Mansfield Award consists of a \$2,000 cash award and certificate, and is presented at the chapter's April meeting, Sustaining Members Night.

Sustaining Members Meritorious Scholarship:

The purpose of this scholarship is to encourage and reward an ASM student/chapter member majoring in metallurgy or materials science who has a good scholastic record and financial need. They should have active extracurricular activities in the field of materials, and an interest in practical materials science. They should be a graduate of a Detroit-area high school.

The Sustaining Members Meritorious Scholarship consists of a \$1,500 cash award and certificate, and is presented at the chapter's April meeting, Sustaining Members Night.

Freshman Scholarship:

The purpose of this scholarship is to encourage outstanding high school students to select metallurgy or materials science as a curriculum in college. The award is based on high school scholastic records and achievements in extracurricular activities. They must be a high school senior or recent graduate of a Michigan high school and be a resident of Southern Michigan.

The Freshman Scholarships consist of a \$1,500 cash award and certificate, and is presented at the chapter's April meeting, Sustaining Members Night.

Marion Semchyshen Award:

The Marion Semchyshen Award is awarded to previous ASM Detroit Chapter Scholarship winners in recognition of their continuing scholastic achievements in the field of metallurgy or materials science. The award is given to a previous Mansfield, Meritorious, or Freshman scholarship winner who has maintained a minimum overall GPA of 2.5.

The Marion Semchyshen Award consists of a \$1,500 cash award and certificate, and is presented at the chapter's April meeting, Sustaining Members Night.

Note: With regards to geographic eligibility, "Detroit Metropolitan Area" is loosely used and includes student chapter locations with ties to the Detroit Chapter. (For example, Michigan Tech University students are eligible.)
